D. Principal's Report

-In the state of CA there is a new way to look at schools. California Dashboard: test scores, attendance rates, college & career (whole child). It's based on progress. No longer is the highest scoring school the best school. A progress model. They want everyone to be proficient or above. Blue, green, yellow, red (blue is highest)...color system. This system is based on progress. What do we need to change? What do we need to keep the same? This takes away the comparison between schools.

- -Go to the California Department of Education website to see this. www.cde.gov
- -I encourage everyone to go on to the website and look. We did amazing.
- -This came from us being a unified community.

Q: what is the data based on?

A: test scores, attendance rates, suspension rates, parent participation.

Tara: we should talk about the 50th celebration. This year was the 50th anniversary for Chaparral. Vision Committee is working on 2 things:1) a display in the library with pictures and memorabilia. We are inviting all previous alums. 2) during Concert on the Green (Friday June 9) we are

inviting all alumni and retired teachers to come. We will have snippets of how the school has grown.

Brazell: the Vision Committee is open to anyone who wants to be on it. It's another group outside of the PFC that helps us...are we staying true to our vision and mission? They helped us create our new website. The Staff Cub Kudos come from the VC.

Tara: 3 members of the committee have 5^{th} graders. So, we need new members.

Brazell: CASP testing is coming up. $3-5^{th}$ grade. Because we have the 1 to 1 acers, everyone can take the test in their classroom when it is convenient for them. They can spread it out over the testing window. I will be letting you know when we will be taking that. There is no time limit. For those who get really stressed out during a test, we can arrange for them to be in a smaller room.

We encourage students to take their time and do their best.

Q: what's the format of the test?

A: multiple choice, short answer, and open-ended written response. Students can use graphic organizers if needed.

Jessica: the district is doing a College Myth-buster Night. 4th and 5th grade welcome.
