Meeting Called to Order 8:57 am

1. General Business

- a. Approval of Minutes (from April 10 Meeting)

- b. Treasurer's Report - Ghazal Hafizi

- c. Hospitality Acknowledgement – Jason congratulated and thanked Carrie and Grace for this wonderful event they put on this morning. Carrie thanked Ghazal and Lanette. She thanked everyone for coming and for people who are looking for ways to get involved. Carrie thanked everyone who came to share their years of knowledge and expertise. There is a packet detailing the different positions and you can talk to Carrie or Grace with any questions. Jason said this event is to introduce parents to what the PFC does and how to make that first step in getting involved.

2. Old Business

- a. Wellness Week – Maria Nicolacakis
 - i. Maria noted they had the hoola hoop assembly, a music assembly (someone brought in over two hundred percussion instruments). Maria thanked everyone who helped at the Farmers Market. She noted that it is a wonderful way for the students to connect, get off screens and show how wellness is a priority.

 - ii. Wednesday, May 8th there will be a fundraising event at The Stand.
- b. Staff Appreciation Week (week of May 6) – Jenna Wood & Alana Schwartz
 - i. Jenna thanked everyone for signing up to bring items in for the luncheon. She noted you will receive an email about bringing flowers next week for the teachers.
 - ii. Jason noted that each day they set up a different theme breakfast for the teachers. The theme is Around the World. Each day will be a different country. On Wednesday they host a big luncheon for the teachers.
 - iii. Lisa talked about the flower bouquets. The room parents handle bouquets for the teachers and then everyone can help make bouquets for the support staff. They hand deliver them to the aids and office staff. People can meet at the upper lunch benches to help. Parking is bad that day so come early. Journey/kinder flowers get dropped off at the middle lunch tables. All other grades can drop off at the upper lunch tables.
- c. Ice Cream Social (May 15-16) – Dayana Kling, Kristy Scott
 - i. Dayana and Kristy noted the Ice Cream Social happens on two evenings. May 15th is for Journeys-2nd grade and Thursday is 3rd-5th grade. Both nights are 5:30pm-7:30pm.

- d. Open House (May 29)
 - i. Open house is Wednesday May 29th 5pm-7pm. In the past they would split the grades but they are still finalizing the schedule for this year. Carrie noted that this year the art display will be in the art room instead of the MPR. There will be food trucks so people can purchase dinner. Carrie said everyone should come, hang out, eat, go see their classes and say hi to the teachers. Carrie noted parking is horrendous so be patient and please respect the neighbors and trash cans.
- e. Variety Show – Meredith Sesser
 - i. Meredith showed this years T-shirts. She noted the 5th graders are filming in two weeks and teachers are going to be in the videos.
